Cellphones, tablets and e-readers



Computer accessories, including keyboards, mice, hard drives, scanners, speakers, flash drives and other devices



Fax machines and desktop printers, including 3-D printers and multifunction printers



DVD players, VCRs, DVRs and other video players



Other TV/monitor accessories, including antennas, cable/satellite equipment, cords and cables, home theater systems, security cameras and other devices



TVs and monitors



Battery-powered phone accessories





Video game consoles, hand-held video games and battery-powered accessories



Wisconsin's electronics recycling law bans most electronics from landfills and incinerators. Electronics contain valuable materials and must be reused or recycled.

- OVD players, VCRs, DVRs and other TV and monitor accessories
