All performance monitoring activities should be documented in the project files. If issues are identified, the related follow-up or corrective action taken should also be documented in the project file.

Compliance Monitoring - WGBH is also responsible for monitoring the subrecipient's compliance with applicable laws and regulations. This can be accomplished in multiple ways. Annually, WGBH will send a questionnaire to all known subrecipients requesting a copy of their most recent Single Audit report and other information. Responses will be sent back to WGBH's Compliance department, which will review the results and follow up on any findings identified. In 2022, what mattered most was reconnecting—in person and across platforms. We found new ways to reach our audiences, wherever they are, with our storytelling. And we worked to innovate, listen and expand public media to make it even more responsive to what matters to you. GBH built bridges that connected people with ideas, fresh perspectives and greater insight, building trust and ensuring closer bonds within our community. Below are our look back at the highlights of 2022.

GBH Education invited diverse learners into our resources, whether in classrooms via PBS LearningMedia or in communities, including Design Squad for older kids in out-of-school settings, Math at the Core for middle schoolers and the NOVA PBS LearningMedia resources for high school students. In total, the team produced 325 resources featuring more than 2,700 assets for PBS Learning Media.

Molly of Denali has a television reach of more than 29.3 million viewers and over 4 million users and 400,000 monthly users on PBS KIDS digital platforms.

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2Gen Labs, a GBH Education research and development pilot program to learn more about how to address parents' educational needs in order to boost student learning, made significant progress. Focusing on immigrant students and their caregivers, the initiative uses a participatory design process, applying the feedback and expertise of families and educators from traditionally underserved communities to create interactive graphic novels centered on culturally responsive science practices.

GBH's science series NOVA, now in its 50th season, is a staple in American classrooms. This year NOVA's documentary Ultimate Space Telescope followed the ups and downs of the complex mission of NASA's revolutionary James Webb Space telescope, adding new content to a NOVA premiere as the telescope delivered its very first images. The film reached more than 2.7 million broadcast viewers and garnered 3.4 million viewers on YouTube. With comprehensive coverage across all its social media platforms in the first three days that the telescope was breaking news, NOVA's content earned 3.5 million impressions and 294,000 engagements. The NOVA YouTube channel earned over 33 million video views in 2022—an increase of 125% over the previous year. On social media, NOVA earned over 68 million video views—up 93% from last year, with nearly 99% coming came from Facebook. Our extensive press coverage earned over 7 billion total impressions.

GBH WORLD's America ReFramed celebrated 10 years delivering documentary series to attract a younger, more diverse audience by sharing multicultural stories from new makers. Fannie Lou Hamer's America: An America Reframed Special was co-produced with the subject's great niece and innovative for using only the civil rights activist's own voice in the narration. It kicked off the 10th season and won GBH WORLD's first-ever IDA Documentary Award. America ReFramed has presented more than 170 multicultural

stories and more than 370 filmmakers (more than half are female and one third are people of color) who reflect the everyday world we share.

In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts describing the nature of the affiliation, and indicating whether he or she has or may have a conflict of interest involving any financial transaction of WGBH. In the event there is a change in the information submitted in the disclosure statement, the person submitting it is to promptly submit written

notification of the change. At the conclusion of the fiscal year prior to the submission of the Form 990, a governing body member is required to disclose any conflicts of interest that may have existed during the prior fiscal year using the provided questionnaire. All transactions disclosed by trustees or officers as related-party transactions shall be reviewed by the audit committee of the board of trustees, provided that only those members of the committee who have no involvement with any related-party transactions involving the Foundation ("Independent Trustees") shall participate in such review. In the case of a transaction that is covered, the audit committee shall determine whether, all factors considered, the transaction is fair and reasonable to, and is in the best interest of the Foundation. Approval of a related-party transaction shall require a majority vote of the Independent Trustees at a meeting at which there is a quorum determined solely with regard to Independent Trustees.

The organization's Compensation Committee of the Board of Trustees is an independent committee, the members of which each year verify that they do not have any conflicts of interest with respect to the compensation paid to the Chief Executive Officer and top management employees. This committee reviewed the confidential feedback from the direct reports that relate to the Chief Executive Officer's annual goals and performance, and determined the Chief Executive Officer's compensation package. The committee also reviewed and approved the compensation package for all executive leaders that was prepared by the CEO and COO. The committee utilized third party data and surveyed the trustees using a questionnaire to benchmark comparable compensation packages for the CEO and other key executive roles in functionally comparable positions and similar sized organizations. The compensation review is an annual process and is documented each year in the compensation committee minutes, in
