Compensation Benefits

- Annual salaries starting at \$50,000.
- Agencies may sponsor eligible recruits to attend Florida Basic Recruit Training Program.
- For many agencies a college degree is not required, but some may offer incentive pay for those who have a degree.
- Opportunities for overtime and off-duty employment for eligible officers and specialty position incentives.
- Certain agencies offer first time officers and officers new to the state sign-on bonuses of up to \$5,000.
- Competitive Area Differential additives are available in some locations for specified positions.
- Several state agencies offer uniform allowances and take home vehicles.
- Agencies offer training, certification, and promotional opportunities for career growth.

Benefits that Support You and Your Family

- The State of Florida pays 2/3 of the cost of health care insurance resulting in monthly premiums of \$50 for individuals, \$180 for a family plan, and \$30 for a family plan if both spouses are employed with the state.
- High risk positions are automatically enrolled in the Florida State Retirement System, 97% of which is funded by the state, and officers can be eligible for retirement at 25 years of service.
- Full-time employees can earn paid leave for various life events and personal needs.
- Employees can receive educational assistance through tuition waiver for up to 18 credit hours a year.
