Marks next to or surrounding other diacritics

The left or right parentheses marks are used in extended IPA in combination with voicing or devoicing diacritics to indicate initial or final partial applicability.

- 1AC1 COMBINING LEFT PARENTHESIS ABOVE LEFT
- 1AC2 COMBINING RIGHT PARENTHESIS ABOVE RIGHT
- 1AC3 COMBINING LEFT PARENTHESIS BELOW LEFT
- 1AC4 O COMBINING RIGHT PARENTHESIS BELOW RIGHT
- 1AC5 COMBINING SQUARE BRACKETS ABOVE
 - intended to surround a diacritic above
 - used to indicate cancellation of an accent in Japanese transliteration
